Transition Chesterfield is a local community group aiming to make Chesterfield more resilient and sustainable. We seek to create positive local solutions to the challenge of climate change. Here are some of our current projects:



Where people can get broken stuff repaired for free, reducing waste and helping people learn how to fix things. broken stuff repaired for free, (3rd Saturdav of the month)





LitterSorters



We collect, sort and record the single use waste that ends up as litter in our parks and paths (2nd Thurs of the month)



Where people bring any spare fruit, vegetable or flower seeds to swap for free, to get unusual and hard to find varieties or to extend the variety of vegetables grown.



We use The Hub on Low Pavements on Friday mornings as a space for discussion, learning, creativity, inspiration and hope for a cleaner, greener future for Chesterfield.



A seasonal project to harvest unwanted fruit and distribute it free of charge or press into juice.





An annual event selling a variety of seed potatoes and other vegetable seeds at low cost, to encourage people to grow their own food.

Advice and ad hoc events to encourage people to save home energy and move to renewables





An annual market event to buy and sell surplus art and craft materials. alongside like-minded artists and crafters from across the local area.



Lobbying for urgent action on climate change via planning applications, council and government policy, including divestment of pensions from fossil fuels.



An organic, community garden, now a separate charity, providing opportunities for people of all ages and abilities to grow food and develop a sense of community.
